Welcome to the newly re-opened James Joyce Centre!The James Joyce Centre is dedicated to promoting an understanding of the life and works of James Joyce.

James Joyce Museum

The James Joyce Tower was one of a series of Martello towers built to withstand an invasion by Napoleon and now holds a museum devoted to the life and works of James Joyce, who made the tower the setting for the first chapter of his masterpiece, *Ulysses*.

Kilmainham Gaol

Malahide Castle

Malahide Castle, set on 250 acres of park land in the pretty seaside town of Malahide, was both a fortress and a private home for nearly 800 years and is an interesting mix of architectural styles.

National Gallery of Ireland

National Museum of Ireland - Natural History

Opened in 1857, this is the oldest purpose-built museum building in Ireland. Please note: The National Museum of Ireland remains closed for refurbishment works and will be reopening late autumn 2009. In the meantime, a temporary exhibition entitled The Dead Zoo At Large - Treasures of the Natural History Museum is on display in the Riding School, Collins Barracks, Benburb Street, Dublin 7.

National Wax Museum Plus

Located in the stunning historical Armoury building in Foster Place, Dublin 2, the National Wax Museum Plus will bring visitors on a memorable journey through time, allowing you to meet some of the great characters that shaped the country.

Number Twenty Nine - Georgian House Museum

Number Twenty Nine is Dublin's Georgian House Museum. Visitors take a guided tour from the basement to the attic, through rooms which have been furnished with original artefacts as they would have been in the years 1790 to 1820.

Saint Patrick's Cathedral

Saint Patrick's Cathedral has contributed much to Irish life throughout its long history (it was founded in 1191).

Skerries Mills

Skerries Mills is a unique experience to visit. This award winning restoration of the Great 5 Sail Windmill, Thatched 4 Sail Windmill and Watermill is set in the town park at the centre of the beautiful seaside town of Skerries.

Tara's Palace

Tara's Palace is undoubtedly one of the world's most significant Dolls Houses. Inspired by Sir Neville Wilkinson's celebrated Titania's Palace of 1907, Ron and Doreen McDonnell sought to recapture the spirit and purpose of Sir Neville, when they began the creation of their own masterpiece - Tara's Palace in 1980.

The Casino, Marino

The Casino is considered to be one of the finest 18th century neo-classical buildings in Europe.

The Fry Model Railway

The Fry Model Railway is a unique collection of handmade models of Irish trains, from the beginning of rail travel to modern times.

The Old Jameson Distillery

A visit to the Old Jameson Distillery is so much more than just a tour, it is an exciting and engaging experience, guaranteed to enlighten and entertain any visitor.

The Shaw Birthplace
